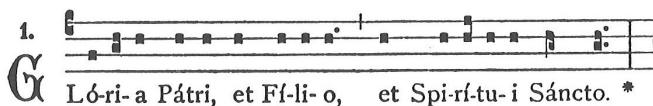

## **Trinity Sunday**

*is celebrated on the  
first Sunday after  
Pentecost and honors  
the Holy Trinity—  
Father, Son and Holy  
Spirit.*

*On Trinity Sunday,  
the Christian Church  
ponders with joy  
and thanksgiving what  
the Father, Son and  
Holy Spirit have done  
to accomplish the  
salvation of sinful  
humanity.*

*We remember the  
Father as our Creator,  
the Son as our Savior,  
and the Holy Spirit as  
our Comforter.*

*Since the  
understanding of all  
scriptural doctrine  
is by faith, which comes  
through the work of  
the Holy Spirit;  
it is appropriate that  
this mystery is  
celebrated on the first  
Sunday after  
Pentecost, when the  
outpouring of the Holy  
Spirit first occurred.*
